FIREFIGHTERS CLAMBER FOR A CHANCE TO CLIMB THE SKY TOWER

This Saturday, 23 May, a record-breaking 80 New Zealand fire brigades will race up the Sky Tower for a chance to claim the fastest man, fastest woman and fastest team.

The firefighters have been training and fundraising for months leading up to the event. This year's event is expected to crush 2008 records of brigade, firefighter and fundraising numbers. The firefighters are taking on the cardio challenge to support the Leukaemia & Blood Foundation (LBF).

The brigades are also targeting the lead fundraiser record. In 2008, the event raised a record \$94,000 -- and for the last three years the Paihia Volunteer Fire Brigade has won the boasting-right as lead fundraisers.

In its sixth year, the event has grown from a challenge between two guys to an intense gut-buster with a total of 422 people – 365 firefighters and 57 auxiliary participants – gearing up to climb.

The brave brigades will compete in a race up the 51 flights – or 1,103 Sky Tower steps – wearing full firefighting kit weighing 25kg.

Hailing as far north as Paihia and south as Alexandra, the New Zealand firefighters will be joined by the South Australian Metropolitan Fire Service and a USA Firefighter team.

The Firefighter Sky Tower Challenge numbers:

- **6** children and adults in New Zealand everyday are diagnosed with leukaemia, lymphoma, myeloma or a related blood condition
- More than **500** contacts with patients and general enquiries every month is managed by the LBF Patient Support Services team
- **10,000** people are living with leukaemia, lymphoma, myeloma or a related blood condition in New Zealand
- Over **\$1,000** each day is the cost of providing LBF's Support Services
- **51** flights of stairs in the Firefighters Sky Tower Challenge
- **1,103** individual steps
- **\$94,000** was raised for LBF in the 2008 Firefighters Sky Tower Challenge
- Over **80** brigades.
- **365** firefighters representing fire brigades from around New Zealand are competing in the 2009 Challenge, including a team from Auckland Airport and Auckland Airport CEO Simon Moutter.
- At **328** metres the Sky Tower is the tallest building in the southern hemisphere
- Auckland Airport is providing a kick-start to the fundraising efforts with a \$15,000 donation. This money has come from the generosity of the travelling public who donate their foreign currency in donation globes positioned throughout the airport.
